## **Section 2.** Instruction to Bidders

A. GENERAL PROVISI	NS .
1. Introduction	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. 	Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP.
	As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website ( <a href="www.ungm.org">www.ungm.org</a> ). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.
2. 3. Eligibility	A vendor should not be suspended, debarred, or otherwise identified as ineligible by any UN Organization or the World Bank Group or any other international Organization. Vendors are therefore required to disclose to UNDP whether they are subject to any sanction or temporary suspension imposed by these organizations.
	It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure that its employees, joint venture members, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their employees meet the eligibility requirements as established by UNDP.

#### 4. Conflict of Interests

4.1

- Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:
  - a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;
  - b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or
  - Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.
- 4.2 In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such a conflict exists.
- 4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following:
  - a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and
  - b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

Failure to disclose such an information may result in the rejection of the proposal or proposals affected by the non-disclosure.

4.4 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this RFP, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Proposal.

#### **B. PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS**

# 5. General Considerations

- 5.1 In preparing the Proposal, the Bidder is expected to examine the RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the RFP may result in rejection of the Proposal.
- 5.2 The Bidder will not be permitted to take advantage of any errors or omissions in the RFP. Should such errors or omissions be discovered, the Bidder must notify the UNDP

# 6. Cost of Preparation of Proposal

6.1 The Bidder shall bear any and all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of the Proposal, regardless of whether its Proposal was selected or not. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.

#### 7. Language

7.1 The Proposal, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.

#### 8. Documents

8.1 The Proposal shall comprise of the following documents:

Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder	9.1 The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an eligible and qualified vendor, using the Forms provided under Section 6 and providing documents required in those forms. In order to award a contract to a Bidder, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfaction.
10. Technical Proposal Format and Content	10.1 The Bidder is required to submit a Technical Proposal using the Standard Forms and templates provided in Section 6 of the RFP.
	10.2 The Technical Proposal shall not include any price or financial information. A Technical Proposal containing material financial information may be declared non-responsive.
	10.3 Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within the time specified and unless otherwise specified by UNDP, and at no expense to UNDP
	10.4 When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall describe the necessary training programme available for the maintenance and operation of the services and/or equipment offered as well as the cost to the UNDP. Unless otherwise specified, such training as well as training materials shall be provided in the language of the Bid as specified in the BDS.
11. Financial Proposals	11.1 The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the Standard Form provided in Section 6 of the RFP. It shall list all major cost components associated with the services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs.
	11.2 Any output and activities described in the Technical Proposal but not priced in the Financial Proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.
	11.3 Prices and other financial information must not be disclosed in any other place except in the financial proposal.
12. Proposal Security	12.1 A Proposal Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Proposal Security shall be valid up to thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the Proposal.
	12.2 The Proposal Security shall be included along with the Technical Proposal. If Proposal Security is required by the RFP but is not found along with the Technical Proposal, the Proposal shall be rejected.
	12.3 If the Proposal Security amount or its validity period is found to be less than what is required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the Proposal.

- 30.1 The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and other RFP documents, applying the evaluation criteria, sub-criteria, and point system specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria). A Proposal shall be rendered non-responsive at the technical evaluation stage if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the BDS. ### **Section 5.** Terms of Reference

# A. Project Title: From Linear to Platform-based Work: an Experimental Platform for UN Joint Programming

#### B. Project Description

On 31 May 2018, the United Nations General Assembly adopted resolution A/RES/72/279 on the repositioning of the United National Development System (UNDS). This resolution ushers in the most comprehensive reform of the UNDS in decades. One of the reform streams is the establishment of a new generation United Nations Country Teams (UNCTs), which will be demand-driven, with enhanced skill-sets and tailored to meet the specific development priorities and needs of countries. The revamped UNCTs will ensure enhanced coordination, increased transparency, efficiency and development effectiveness.

The successful implementation of the UNDS reform requires a paradigm shift and a new business model, which will enable joint programming and advanced common business operations. The new generation UNCTs will be well positioned to break the silos driven by agencies specific mandates and the projectized approach to addressing complex development challenges. This repositioning calls for significant changes in the setup, leadership, accountability mechanisms and capacities of the UNDS, so that it can provide countries with the support they need to achieve their Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as well as to meet the Paris commitments on climate change.

The UNCT Moldova is looking for an innovative, platform-based solutions to reposition the UNDS and revamp the UNCT. The platform-based modus operandi will leverage the comparative advantages of UN agencies, will increase synergies and complementarities, will harness competencies, resources and skills available across the UNDS and the wider ecosystem for the benefit of the people of Moldova. Therefore, under the framework of the UN-wide innovation platform window within the Delivering Together for Sustainable Development Facility (DTF), the UNCT Moldova mobilized resources to test an innovative platform-based model, which will serve as a prototype for further fine-tuning and scaling up.

The platform-based model will enable UNCT to jointly develop ideas and generate home grown solutions, mobilize resources, communicate messages around the Agenda 2030, SDGs and United Nations Development Assistance Framework, and implement joint programs. It will be a powerful instrument for sharing knowledge and experience; building partnerships and coalitions, and harnessing the capacity of the wider ecosystem.

The process of defining a new platform-based model for the UNCT Moldova encompasses five interrelated activities:

- a) Foresight session "Joint Programing for Development in 2030: Exploring Potential Futures, Scenarios and Strategies" (took place on July 17-19, 2018).
- b) UNCT Moldova network analysis
- c) UNCT Moldova-as-a-Platform design
- d) UNCT Moldova Platform prototype and testing
- e) Knowledge gathering and sharing.

The UNCT Moldova is seeking a consultancy company to undertake the network analysis of UNCT Moldova (activity 2). The recruited company is expected to use and build on the insights of the foresight session and to generate results that will inform the chronologically subsequent activities.

#### C. Scope of Services, Expected Outputs and Target Completion

The key goal of this assignment is to undertake a comprehensive analysis of the UNCT Moldova as a network composed of UN agencies, relevant outer actors, activities and relevant links among actors and activities. The results of the analysis should inform the UNCT Moldova on the size, structure, complexity, key relationships, flows of resources and bottlenecks of its ecosystem, as well on the potential ways to empower the ecosystem, thereby enhancing the impact on the national SDGs.

Methodology

**UNCT MOLDOVA: KEY NETWORK COMPONENTS** 

The UNCT Moldova can be approached as a two-mode network composed of actors and activities by which actors affiliate.

The actors' set is composed of UN agencies (inner actors) and a number of relevant outer actors.

Inner actors are the UN specialized agencies, each with own mandate, leadership, and funding. Of all the UN organizations active in the country, 11 have a permanent presence ("resident agencies"), while 7 non-resident agencies contribute to national development – either remotely or on an ad-hoc basis.

Outer actors are international, governmental, non-governmental or private entities which play strategic roles in the activities undertaken by the UN agencies. These roles may refer to being donor, implementing partner, beneficiary, etc.

Activities affiliate inner and outer actors. In the context of these Terms of Reference, "activity" is a general term, referring to projects, programs or processes requiring joint participation of UN agencies and outer actors.

The links among actors and activities can be either flows (financial, human resources, data) or relational, as defined by their roles (donors, project designer, project implementing unit, beneficiary, advisory etc.).

As the practice of defining an activity is not uniform across UN agencies (projects in some, programs or clusters in others), a standardized approach will be required since affiliation to activities is a key source of ties between actors of the UNCT network and should be used as primary unit of observations for the discovery of social links between the inner actors, as well as for discovery of outer actors and the connections to activities.

The specific objectives of this assignment are the following:

- Conduct preliminary desk research and interviews to define and agree with the UNCT Moldova Task Force the boundary of the network and scope of research;
- For each UN agency, define the list of on-going and forthcoming activities and collect the data on the
  most essential attributes, including, but not limited to targeted SDGs, overall budget, strategic
  interventions as listed in the UNDAF, duration, type (continuous, ad-hoc, recurrent);
- For each pair actor-activity collect data on the functions played by the actor and associated flows of resources to / from activities;

- Analyze the network nodes roles, influences, mutual relationships and overall positions, discover potential subnetworks, cliques, clusters, slices and potential structural holes;
- For the most essential components of the business models (fundraising, service offering, mode of engagement with outer actors), assess to what degree are UN agencies aligned / complementary /or in dissonance;
- Identify the key bottlenecks and potential accelerators for improvement of the overall network coherence, collaboration, agility and robustness;
- Write draft and final reports;
- Strengthen the capacity of UN staff on basics of the organizational network analysis.
