1. Background Information

UN Women is operational in Moldova since 2010. Currently, it is implementing its Strategic Note for 2014-2017. UN-Women closely cooperates with the government, civil society, and private sector to advance social, economic and political rights and opportunities for women and girls, placing special focus on those from marginalized groups. These include, but not limited to rural women, Romani women, women with disabilities, young women, women living with or affected by HIV, women survivors of violence and trafficking, women migrants, elderly women and women in Transnistria and Gagauzia. We work with them to challenge the stereotypical image of women. We apply new tools to ensure women's proactive engagement in designing, prototyping and implementing the state policies and plans. Thus, UN-Women's operation in Moldova focuses on bringing about concrete change in the lives of women and the society as a whole through the following three key areas:

Eliminating Violence Against Women. UN-Women employs adaptive solutions by empowering survivors of violence from various backgrounds to speak up and advocate for concrete actions with their peers as well as with authorities and the media. This approach so far has led to changing perceptions of survivors by the authorities, media and other women, so they are acknowledged and involved as the key experts in eliminating VAW in legislative, policy, institutional and community level initiatives. Lately, UN-Women has started to mobilize other actors of society including youth, religious leaders, former perpetrators, judicial staff, police, members of the artistic community, so that under the leadership of the survivors of violence, the 'whole of society' can produce long-overdue results for women. Apart from these, UN-Women has continued the conventional technical interventions/solutions, such as support to government authorities and civil society partners to implement provisions of the Domestic Violence Law (2008) and strengthening the legislative framework by further aligning it to international norms and standards. UN-Women's next Strategic Note for 2018-2022 in Moldova will build on these results and further inform support to the country in this area of work at all levels.

Women in Politics and Leadership. Women's opportunities to hold elected office in Moldova are still low, with women from marginalized groups virtually absent from decision-making positions. In response to these challenges, UN-Women is leading a comprehensive UN joint programme on promoting women in politics, implemented together with UNDP and two civil society organizations. Partnerships are forged with legislators, institutions and community leaders to empower them to increasingly work with women, especially those who are marginalized from the decision-making, thus enabling the women to lead the required changes. This is being done through community level mentoring and role modeling, exchange of good practices and establishment of self-support networks, especially among women elected for the first time in Parliament and local councils or appointed as mayors. UN-Women will work further to strengthen the networks between women from all levels and continue legislative and policy work in order to ensure women's fair access to politics and real influence in a sustainable manner.

Women's Economic Empowerment. UN-Women has initiated a number of strategic actions in this area. The first state strategy for women's entrepreneurship was jointly created with women in business and currently being considered by the Government. Additionally, the government launched a process of re-engineering public services (as part of the Public Services Modernization Reform agenda) by taking over a successful public services provision model through one-stop shop piloted by UN-Women. For over two years, more than 100 girls, including Romani girls, girls with disabilities, girls who experienced violence and girls who are left behind by their migrant parents, benefited from an initiative on information and communication technologies (ICTs) as one of the promising employment and self-employment opportunities. UN Women

also works closely with policy makers to adopt state programmes that empower women in technology and entrepreneurship.

UN-Women's presence has evolved from being a project-based office in 2010 to a Country Office with full delegated authority as of 2015. During these years, UN-Women's role has also evolved gradually, both from the technical and strategic standpoints. At the start, our mind was set around 'working for women', which later evolved into 'working with women'. In the immediate future, we are seeing our path towards increasingly acting as a 'facilitator' for the creation of an environment, whereby 'women-to-women' serve as a vehicle for sustainable change towards greater equality in partnership with men and boys.

To support this effective partnership, UN Women places an important emphasis on communicating for behavior change and bring development assistance results, as well as the donors' contribution to these achievements closer to all. For this purpose, UN Women Moldova seeks to embark on a series of targeted communications interventions that would show-case the results of women in communities from Moldova and their impact on the lives of women, men and other community members as part of the leadership for change spirit. This is particularly important when communications efforts are geared toward resource mobilization, and donor countries are increasingly insisting on documented results to demonstrate value for money.

As a part of UN Women work in Moldova there are also planned a series of events such as conferences, workshops, roundtables, study visits, trainings, for which visibility needs to be ensured and target audience reached. A prudent approach is to have on hand a long-term agreement with a photojournalist who can be brought on board to address visual communications needs on an ad hoc and as-needed basis.

In view of documenting the activities and creating a pool of image resources UN Women Moldova seeks to hire a photojournalist for providing timely and qualitative still photography services.

Organizational Context:

Under the overall guidance of the Programme Specialist and direct supervision of Communications Associate, the photojournalist provides high quality photography services, when required (with advance notice). The photojournalist demonstrates a client-oriented approach, tact and ability to work with people of different national and cultural backgrounds. The photojournalist ensures effective and efficient provision of services, full confidentiality in all aspects of assignment, management of information flow and follow-up on deadlines and commitments made.

2. Objectives of the Assignment:

Capture and provide high quality and high resolution images of events, missions, including visual stories of women, men and children in the target communities where UN Women is implementing its activities.

The photojournalist will be required to have his/her own equipment (a semi-professional or professional DSLR camera, lenses, flashes and all other necessary accessories) and be available for travel immediately as needed to communities from Moldova in order to cover various stories, events and topics. The transportation and logistical arrangements will be ensured by UN Women Moldova Programmes.

3. Scope of Work:

- To generate compelling photography to illustrate specific stories or events. Capture high resolution images of individuals, families, groups, events at field locations related to the implementation of the UN Women activities and programmes;
- Provide at least 15 selected images from minor assignment/event and at least 30 inspiring images from the major events immediately following the events in electronic format;
- Caption each photograph with specific details such as geographical location, name of the person, a quote or a short description of the person's story, a few lines (when required).

4. Duty Station:

This is a home-based assignment with field visits in local communities in Moldova and events.

5. Duration of the Assignment and Expected Deliverables against Timeframes:

Duration of the assignment is from **01 May to 31 December 2017**. The Consultant is expected to spend up to 80 working days on a non-consecutive basis throughout the assignment.

Expected Deliverables:

- Photographs – both color and black and white, and related cut lines (photo descriptions);
- ‘Best of’ photographs that have been taken during each of the assignment (at least 15-30, depending on event);
- Photographs shall be provided to UN Women through online transfer or on an external format, e.g. hard drive, flash disk, when requested;
- In order to reflect an event in media and social media in an appropriate and effective time, min 10 photographs shall be provided within the first couple of hours after the closing of the event.
- Photographs shall conform to UN Women ethical reporting guidelines and appropriate visual portrayal of UN Women programme related areas.

The photographs should be a mix of portraits and action shots. The majority of the images should be portraits of the subjects against a setting that is relevant to the story. For instance, if the subject is a researcher, the photograph could be set in her office, to provide important context to the story. The portraits should be posed against a desired backdrop, and lit well and evenly.

However, in addition to the portraits it is also important to capture the subject in action, either in conversation with a beneficiary of the programme they spearheaded, or otherwise engaged in an activity that helps drive the story home. For these images, it may not be possible to control the environment and so it is not necessary that these images are lit or posed in the same way as the portraits.

The photographs should depict the subject as empowered and strong, and the mood should be uplifting and positive as opposed to dark or moody. The case studies focus on the process of change, in finding positive solutions to overcoming challenges to achieving women’s economic and social rights, and the subjects’ role in developing programmes or campaigns that protect and uphold these rights and empower women. In this context, it is especially important for the photographs to portray the subjects as leaders and as activists who embody this positive change.

Specific requirements for photos:

- Color and Black and White;
- In electronic form or flash-card;
- Format of electronic pictures: JPEG, TIFF, BMP, PNG;
- Colors: minimum RGB, maximum CMYK;
- Resolution: high (minimum 300 dpi scale up to A1 size for print and minimum 72 dpi for web) that will be of an internationally acceptable standard;
- Pixel dimension: 1600x900.

Copyrights

The photographs will be copyrighted to UN Women and any violation of copyright law will be pursued appropriately. All photos taken by the photojournalist will be credited to the name of the person as well.

6. Financial arrangements and performance evaluation

Payment will be done in separate installments upon delivery of services and certification by the Country Office no later than at the end of each quarter. In case the amount of work to be paid exceeds 5 days during a month period, payment will be done within two weeks after the submission and approval of the delivery.

Photojournalist’s performance will be evaluated against such criteria as: timeliness, responsibility, initiative, communication, accuracy, and quality of the products delivered.

7. Services and Facilities to be provided by the UN Women

The Photojournalist will work under overall guidance of the Programme Specialist and direct supervision of the Communication Associate. The consultant will use his/her own equipment. The transportation to targeted communities and logistical arrangements will be ensured by UN Women Moldova.

8. Competencies:

- Proven networking skills, and ability to generate interest in UN Women’s mandate;

- Strong initiative-taker;
- Focuses on impact and results for client;
- Consistently approaches work with energy and a positive, constructive attitude;
- Demonstrate and safeguard ethics and integrity.

9. Qualifications:

Education:

- University Degree preferable in an area related to this position;
- Formal training in photography is an asset;
- Communication and media experience and skills are desirable;

Experience:

- At least 3 years of work experience in photography in social/development area
- Specific experience as photojournalist (from the sample portfolio).
- Proven ability in photography and ability to assimilate and communicate complex visual messages in an engaging and user-friendly manner (*sample portfolio to be provided*);
- Prior experience of working with UN agencies, NGOs and INGOs and understanding of the development sector is required (*sample photographs taken from various donor or government led events*)
- Advanced knowledge and skills of MS Office, including Corel Draw, Adobe Photoshop and other editing tools is required
- National and/or international awards and prizes in photography, would be an asset.

Language Requirements

- Fluency in Romanian and Russian. Knowledge of English will be an asset.

10. Application Procedure:

Interested candidates are invited to submit their online applications by **18 April 2017** with the following documents.

- Duly filled Personal History Form PHF11/CV (downloadable from http://www.unwomen.org/wp-content/uploads/2011/01/P_11_form_UNwomen.doc);
- Letter of Intent to include a brief overview about which of your previous experiences makes you the most suitable candidate for the advertised position.
- A selection of photos (no more than 10) featuring stories and portraits of women and girls, including from various social, age and professional groups; plus descriptive captions.
- A selection of photos (no more than 10) from various events
- Financial proposal (with breakdown of fee on a per day and a per half-day basis, which would also include delivery of at least 15 electronic photos per a specific event). The financial proposal shall include a breakdown of this lump sum amount (daily rate and number of anticipated working days), Please see Annex I: Price Proposal Guideline and Template and Annex II: Price Proposal Submission Form

In July 2010, the United Nations General Assembly created UN Women, the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women. The creation of UN Women came about as part of the UN reform agenda, bringing together resources and mandates for greater impact. It merges and builds on the important work of four previously distinct parts of the UN system (DAW, OSAGI, INSTRAW and UNIFEM), which focused exclusively on gender equality and women's empowerment.

The United Nations in Moldova is committed to workforce diversity. Women, persons with disabilities, Roma and other ethnic or religious minorities, persons living with HIV, as well as refugees and other non-citizens legally entitled to work in the Republic of Moldova, are particularly encouraged to apply.

11. Evaluation of Applicants:

Initially, individual consultants will be short-listed based on the following minimum qualification criteria:

- University Degree preferable in an area related to this position;
Formal training in still photography;
- At least 3 years of work experience in photography in social/development area

For evaluation of short-listed candidates, a cumulative analysis scheme will be applied with a total score being obtained upon the combination of weighted technical and financial attributes. Cost under this method of analysis is rendered as an award criterion, which will be 30% out of a total score of 300 points.

Evaluation of submitted offers will be done based on the following formula:

$$B = T + \frac{C_{low}}{C} \times X$$

where:

- T* is the total technical score awarded to the evaluated proposal (only to those proposals that pass 70% of maximum 210 points obtainable under technical evaluation);
- C* is the price of the evaluated proposal;
- C_{low}* is the lowest of all evaluated proposal prices among responsive proposals; and
- X* is the maximum financial points obtainable (90 points)

Technical evaluation will be represented through desk review of applications and further interview will be organized if needed, depending on the short-listed candidates' qualifications.

A) Technical Evaluation: The technical part is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Terms of Reference (TOR).

B) Financial evaluation:

In the Second Stage, the financial proposal of candidates, who have attained minimum 70% score in the technical evaluation (at least 147 points), will be compared.

C) An interview/practical test may also be used for the selection of best candidates.

Winning candidate

The winning candidate will be the candidate, who has accumulated the highest aggregated score (technical scoring + financial scoring).

Annex I: Price Proposal Guideline and Template

The prospective Individual Consultant should take the following explanations into account during submission of his/her price proposal.

1. Daily fee

The daily price proposal should indicate a "lump sum amount" which is "all-inclusive"; All costs (professional fees, communications, consumables during field related missions, etc.) that could possibly be incurred by the Contractor needs to be factored into the proposed price.

UN Women will not withhold any amount of the payments for tax and/or social security related payments. UN Women shall have no liability for taxes, duties or other similar charges payable by the Individual Contractor in respect of any amounts paid to the Individual Contractor under this Contract, and the Contractor acknowledges that UN Women will not issue any statements of earnings to the Individual contractor in respect of any such payments.

2. Travel costs

UN Women will ensure transportation to local communities. UN Women will not cover transportation cost within Chisinau.

3. Daily Subsistence Allowance

Not applicable.

4. Currency of the price proposal

The applicants are requested to submit their price proposals in MDL. In case of proposals in other currency, these shall be converted into MDL using the official UN exchange rate for currency MDL conversion to MDL at the date of applications' submission deadline.
