1. BACKGROUND

At the global level, UNDP's long-term vision is to help create a world in which digital is an empowering force for people and planet. Digital technology is a fundamental force for change in this century, reshaping economies, government, and civil society – thereby impacting almost every aspect of development. The profound consequences and exponential pace of digital transformation demands both local action and global leadership to reimagine development in a digital age.

In a rapidly evolving digital landscape, accentuated by the challenges and opportunities presented by the pandemic, the urgency for digital transformation has been brought to the forefront.

Recognizing this imperative, the Government of the Republic of Moldova has embarked on a comprehensive journey to harness the potential of the fourth industrial revolution. This initiative aims to revolutionize public institutions and society through a holistic and inclusive approach, ensuring that the benefits of digitalization are widespread and sustainable.

The Government of the Republic of Moldova has adopted the Digital Transformation Strategy for 2023-2030 (DTS), a forward-looking initiative elaborated with UNDP Moldova support, which underscores the country's commitment to embracing digital innovation and exploring a "whole-of-society" approach, thus ensuring that transformation is inclusive and sustainable.

The Digital Transformation Strategy 2023-2030, as well as the UNDP Digital Strategy 2022-2025, serve as the cornerstone of the current UNDP Moldova project, aligning with its mission to expedite digital transformation across various sectors, integrate digital tools in both public administration and the private sector, simplifying interactions between citizens and the state, and propelling the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

UNDP Moldova Digital Transformation portfolio

UNDP's mission is critical in supporting the complex and dynamic landscape of sustainable development in Moldova. Our engagements across government sectors, civil society, and academia are crucial in achieving the ambitious targets set by the SDGs agenda. In this context, the UNDP Moldova CO is strategically positioned as a reliable, responsive, and trusted provider of development services, supporting the Government's efforts to pursue its priorities.

As part of the CPD for 2023-2027, UNDP has committed to adopting a more integrated programme cycle approach to better leverage the value for system change to overcome institutional weaknesses in the country. Aligned with the UNSDCF 2023-2027, and in the spirit of building a #FutureSmartUNDP, part of the UNDP Strategic Plan 2022-2025, corporate tools such as digital transformation and strategic innovation will be used to help the Government unpack and tackle complex development challenges that affect progress towards sustainable human development.

As the pace of digital technologies rapidly changes in availability, accessibility, and impact, and the digital disruption picks up, it is important that UNDP can leverage existing and emerging technologies in a pragmatic and structured manner to become a better partner. UNDP's ambition is not only to support governments and local communities to become "digital by default" but also to make sure digital solutions and initiatives aim and deliver impact. The pandemic, war in Ukraine, and other multiple crises have highlighted the reliance on digital tools and timely data and emphasized

the need for digital transformation, which has become one of the highest priorities for Moldova to impact all areas of human life.

Rethinking digital transformation opportunities

Digital transformation is already visible in Moldova, as the country has begun to transfer legal, social, and civil services delivery to online platforms. Although Moldova has (i) a developed digital infrastructure, with 4G coverage at 98%, (ii) well-placed e-Governance architecture, and (iii) an ICT sector with accelerated development, the country needs to systemically rethink digital transformation opportunities and focus on systemic transformation. Moldova must close the digital divide between rural and urban areas, people of different ages and genders, and improve/harmonize the legislative framework to align with international standards. UNDP supported the Government in developing a comprehensive National 2023-2030 Digital Transformation Strategy, which represents a bold engagement to accelerate digital transformation of the nation by exploring a 'whole-of-society' approach and is further actively engaged in ensuring that transformation is inclusive and sustainable.

A whole-of-society approach at the center of digital transformation

The National 2023-2030 Digital Transformation Strategy, as well as the UNDP Digital Strategy 2022-2025, serve as the cornerstone of the current UNDP Moldova engagements to expedite digital transformation across various sectors, integrate digital tools in both public administration and the private sector, simplify interactions between citizens and the state, and propel the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

UNDP Moldova is supporting women's and girls' integration in the field of science and technology, particularly promoting STEEAM-based education. To tackle digital inequality, UNDP Moldova has been equipping schools across the country with modern technology such as desk computers, laptops, smartboards, projectors, interactive boards, portable STEEAM laboratory devices, and tablets. This effort ensures that students, teachers, and school managers can futureproof their skills early in their lives and careers. Collaboration with programs such as "Tekwill in Every School," Future Classroom, UNICEF, and the European Union further enhances these efforts. Additionally, since the outbreak of the war in Ukraine, UNDP has created opportunities for refugee children and women to familiarize themselves with STEEAM disciplines and acquire tech skills.

From e-Governance to digital government

National policies and regulatory frameworks for new technologies are often implemented reactively. In an era of accelerating digital transformation, governments must take proactive action to lead the way despite imperfect digital infrastructures and modest skill capacities within authorities. Governments need to increase their use of digital technology to deliver more effective services to both general and marginalized populations. This involves adding new value, promoting innovation, and reimagining development for the digital age.

UNDP Moldova has initiated the development of several portfolio interventions with cross-cutting digital transformation components (including "Accelerating a Just Energy Transition").

Digital Delivery Unit

Engaging a set of activities that facilitate the digital transformation of governance and the adoption of evidence-based policymaking, UNDP aims to significantly enhance the capacity of public institutions to plan and deliver more inclusive, accountable, and responsive public services.

Central to this effort is the support in the operationalization of the National Digitalization Council and the advancement of UNDP Moldova network of digital focal points within key ministries, designed to spearhead the strategic planning and implementation of the Digital Transformation Strategy.

UNDP support for the Ministry of Economic Development and Digitalization underscores the importance of a comprehensive Data Governance Framework and the formulation of evidence-based use cases, ensuring informed decision-making and increased governmental operational efficiency.

2. OBJECTIVE AND EXPECTED OUTPUTS

UNDP Moldova seeks to contract a National Consultant (hereinafter "the Chief Digital Expert") to integrate the Digital Delivery Unit under the Ministry of Economy and Digitalization and facilitate the implementation of the National Digital Transformation Strategy 2030.

To achieve these objectives, the Chief Digital Expert is expected to conduct the following tasks:

• Liaise with the network of existing digital focal points across line Ministries to align and integrate digital transformation efforts (100% Digital agenda of the Moldovan Government);

- Facilitate the operationalization of the National Council for Digitalization, under the aegis of the Ministry of Economic Development and Digitalization;
- Oversee the development and implementation of the three programs under the National Digital Transformation Strategy, specifically the Digital Society Development Program, the ICT Sector and Digital Economy Development Program, and the Public Sector e-Transformation Program.
- Support the development and implementation of a comprehensive methodology for service digitalization;
- Participate and provide advisory in the scoping of version 2.0 of the EVO digital identity app.
- Provide expert advice to the Ministry on assessing digital transformation requirements for transposing the EU acquis and identify areas where Moldova's digital infrastructure and public services need to adapt to meet EU standards.

The Consultant is expected to collaborate closely with the Ministry of Economic Development and Digitalization, particularly the State Secretary for Digitalization, the UNDP Moldova Country Office and experts, partner institutions, and stakeholders to deliver professional, effective, and high-quality contributions.

4. INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENTS

The timeframe for the work of the Consultant is planned for the period August 2024 – July 2025.

During this time, the Consultant is expected to work a total of 216 working days (part-time consultancy).

The Consultant will report to the UNDP Moldova Policy Specialist, or his designee, who will be responsible for supervising consultant's performance. Provided deliverables shall be confirmed by the Ministry of Economic Development Digitalization.

For the duration of the assignment the Project will provide the Consultant with the necessary information and materials for the fulfilment of the assignment.

The fulfillment of the assignment will include desk reviews, development of analytical tools, reports and documents, as well as facilitation and participation in associated meetings and/or public events.

All communications and documentation related to the assignment will be in Romanian and/or English.

5. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

Payments will be disbursed in tranches upon submission and validation of deliverables (certifying that the services have been satisfactorily performed).

Travel

Travel cost is not envisaged under current assignment.

8. EVALUATION

Initially, individual consultants will be short-listed based on the following minimum qualification criteria:

- University degree (or higher) in Informational Technologies, Engineering, Business Administration, Management, Economics, or other relevant fields.
- At least 5 (five) years of progressive experience (at the national and/or international level) in management, consultancy, or technical advisory within the field of informational technologies and/or data.
- At least 3 (three) years of experience providing advisory services in digital governance.
- Citizenship of the Republic of Moldova

The short-listed individual consultants will be further evaluated based on the following methodology:

Cumulative analysis

The award of the contract shall be made to the individual consultant whose offer has been evaluated / determined as: a) responsive/ compliant/ acceptable, and

- b) having received the highest score out of a pre-determined set of weighted technical and financial criteria specific to the solicitation.
- * Technical Criteria weight 60% (300 pts);
- * Financial Criteria weight 40% (200 pts).

Only candidates obtaining a minimum of 210 points for the Technical Evaluation shall be considered for the Financial Evaluation.

Winning candidate

The winning candidate will be the candidate who has accumulated the highest aggregated score (technical scoring + financial scoring).
