		Proposers shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendment made in writing by UNDP. This RFP is conducted in accordance with Policies and Procedures of UNDP which can be accessed at UNDP Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures/Procurement .			
		As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.			
2.	Interpretation of the RFP	Any proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the proposer and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any proposer as a result of this RFP.			
3. - b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

Failure to disclose such information may result in the rejection of the proposal or proposals affected by the non-disclosure.

The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this RFP, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Proposal.

Proposers shall not be eligible to submit a proposal if at the time of proposal submission:

- is included in the Ineligibility List, hosted by <u>UNGM</u>, that aggregates information disclosed by Agencies, Funds or Programs of the UN System;
- is included in the <u>Consolidated United Nations Security Council Sanctions List</u>, including the <u>UN Security Council Resolution 1267/1989 list</u>;
- is included in the <u>World Bank Corporate Procurement Listing of Non-Responsible</u> Vendors and World Bank Listing of Ineligible Firms and Individuals.

5. Proprietary information

The RFP documents and any Terms of Reference or information issued or furnished by UNDP are issued solely for the purpose of enabling a proposal to be completed and may not be used for any other purpose. The RFP documents and any additional information provided to proposers shall remain the property of UNDP. All documents which may form part of the proposal will become the property of UNDP, who will not be required to return them to your firm.

6. Publicity

During the RFP process, a proposer is not permitted to create any publicity in connection with the RFP.

7. Clarification of solicitation documents

Proposers may request clarifications on any of the RFP documents no later than the date indicated in Section 3: Data Sheet. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing in the manner indicated in Section 3: Data Sheet. Explanations or interpretations provided by personnel other than the named contact person will not be considered binding or official.

UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in Section 3: Data Sheet.

UNDP shall endeavour to provide responses to clarifications in an expeditious manner, but any delay in such response shall not cause an obligation on the part of UNDP to extend

8.  UNDP shall not be kept liable for any fluctuations of the exchange market during contract implementation, the Contractor being legally responsible to register any loss/gain of currency exchange resulting from payments against the Contract in accordance with the national legislation.

15. Duties and taxes

Article II, Section 7, of the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities provides, inter alia, that the United Nations, including UNDP as a subsidiary organ, is exempt from all direct taxes, except charges for public utility services, and is exempt from customs restrictions, duties, and charges of a similar nature in respect of articles imported or exported for its official use. All proposals shall be submitted net of any direct taxes and any other taxes and duties, unless otherwise specified in Section 3: Data Sheet

16. Proposal validity period

Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in Section 3: Data Sheet, commencing on the deadline for submission of proposals. A proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.

During the proposal validity period, the proposer shall maintain its original proposal without any change, including the availability of the key personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.

In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request proposers to extend the period of validity of their proposals. The request and the responses shall be made in writing and shall be considered integral to the proposal.

If the proposer agrees to extend the validity of its proposal, it shall be done without any change to the original proposal but will be required to extend the validity of the proposal security, if required, for the period of the extension, and in compliance with Article 17 (Proposal security) in all respects.

The proposer has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its proposal without forfeiting the proposal security, if required, in which case, the proposal shall not be further evaluated.

17. Proposal security

A proposal security, if required by Section 3: Data Sheet, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the Section 3: Data Sheet. The proposal security shall be valid for a minimum of thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the proposal.

The proposal security shall be included along with the proposal. If a proposal security is required by the RFP but is not found in the proposal, the offer shall be rejected.

If the proposal security amount, or its validity period, is found to be less than is required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the proposal.

In the event an electronic submission is allowed in Section 3: Data Sheet, proposers shall include a copy of the proposal security in their proposal and the original of the proposal security must be sent via courier or hand delivery as per the instructions in Section 3: Data Sheet.

Unsuccessful proposers' proposal securities will be discharged/returned as promptly as possible but no later than thirty (30) days after the expiration of the period of proposal validity prescribed by UNDP pursuant to Article 16 (Proposal Validity Period).

The Proposal security may be forfeited by UNDP, and the proposal rejected, in the event of any, or combination, of the following conditions:

18. Joint Venture, Consortium or Association

If the proposer is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the proposal, each such legal entity will confirm in their joint proposal that:

- they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority
 to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and
 severally, and this will be evidenced by a duly notarized agreement among the
 legal entities, which will be submitted along with the proposal; and
- if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who will be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.

After the deadline for submission of proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP.

If a JV, Consortium or Association's proposal is the proposal selected for award, UNDP will award the contract to the joint venture, in the name of its designated lead entity. The lead entity will sign the contract for and on behalf of all other member entities.

The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association shall abide by the provisions of Article 19 (Only one Proposal) herein in respect of submitting only one proposal.

The description of the organization of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entities in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.

A JV, Consortium or Association, in presenting its track record and experience, should clearly differentiate between:

- Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
- Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium, or Association.

Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.

JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.

19. Only one proposal

The proposer (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.

Proposals submitted by two (2) or more proposers shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:

- they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or
- any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
- they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or

SECTION 5: TERMS OF REFERENCE

A. Project Description

During 2024 – 2028, UNDP is implementing the programme "Transforming education in Moldova through Model Schools", funded by the Norwegian Agency for Development Cooperation (Norad)². The overarching Programme objective of the project is to enhance the quality and effectiveness of Moldova's education system through the transformation of district schools into Model Schools.

This will be achieved through the following two main outcomes:

- Transform five schools into Model Schools with a modern learning environment and facilities enabling better learning outcomes and improved efficiency of the school network. These schools will undergo significant gender and disability responsive renovations, to create modern, inclusive learning environments with upgraded infrastructure, and new furniture. Green school principles will be incorporated to reduce environmental impact.
- Facilitate the development of 21st century skills of students through improving teaching and learning practices
 and supporting organizational development. This includes supporting the curricular reform, strengthening
 initial teacher training, and enhancing local education governance. Activities will focus on developing relevant
 curricula, providing continuous professional development for teachers, and improving school autonomy and
 management

Under this joint Project, UNDP will support:

- 1. Capital renovations in five schools to ensure student friendly learning spaces and furniture, and accessible facilities for teachers/students with disabilities (ensuring accessibility of all learning, administrative, outdoor, WASH facilities), under the Outcome 1.
- 2. Supporting the curricular reform, enhancing the quality of curricular materials and educational content; strengthening the initial and continuous teachers training in the implementation of STEAM and interdisciplinary approaches, use of active teaching methods such as project-based learning, problem-based learning, inquiry-based learning and others, with special focus on science disciplines, integration of green and sustainability practices into the curricula; improving local level education governance and school management and autonomy to enhance the quality of education, under Outcome 2.

To support the conduct of the second component, specifically supporting the implementation of teacher training on active teaching and learning methods such as project-based learning, inquiry-based learning and other modern pedagogies, will be undertaken by an organization or a consortium of organizations.

Background

The Moldovan education system faces a complex array of challenges, including underperforming rural schools, an inefficient school network, resource shortages, and a significant teacher deficit.

Moldova's school network includes 1,196 primary schools, gymnasiums, and lyceums serving 331,000 students from grades 1 to 12. A notable issue is the inefficiency caused by 22% of schools having fewer than 100 pupils, while less than 3% of students attend these institutions. Despite allocating 5.8% of GDP to education, schools remain underfunded and lack basic infrastructure upgrades and educational technologies. Many rural school facilities are so outdated that they fail to meet basic sanitation and hygiene standards. Rural school children have limited access to water, sanitation and hygiene facilities in their school [1]. This fragmentation impacts student performance, as evidenced by the 2022 PISA results showing significantly better outcomes in larger schools compared to smaller, rural ones.

The most recent PISA results, released in December 2023, reveal a concerning trend: nearly 50% of all Moldovan pupils, and a significant 70% of those attending schools with fewer than 400 students struggle to achieve basic proficiency in reading, writing, and science by age 15. In addition, the PISA results indicate on drastic discrepancies

between small and larger schools' educational outcomes – with 7 out of 10 pupils in large schools attaining the minimum competence levels, compared to only 3 out of 10 pupils from small schools (under 400 students) performing at minimum level across the three domains assessed (reading, mathematics, and science).

In response, the Ministry of Education and Research (MER) is focusing on optimizing the school network by transforming larger district schools into Model Schools. 35 schools have been selected, one per district/municipality, to serve as Model Schools featuring modern infrastructure, high-quality teaching staff, modern equipment, inclusive management, and school buses for transportation.

Education performance

The social, economic, and cultural status and learning context have a significant influence on students' performance in PISA. The learning context refers to the school environment, which includes the qualification of teachers, the educational process, school infrastructure, the provision of modern equipment and teaching resources, extracurricular activities, as well as students' perceptions, aspirations, beliefs, and motivation. The Ministry of Education and Research aims to improve the average PISA score by 15% in the next edition, which would mean reaching the average level of OECD countries — a very ambitious goal for Moldova. Investments in physical infrastructure and teacher training are essential to achieve this goal.

In May 2024, UNDP Moldova analysed the data from the 2022 PISA questionnaires, which revealed a number of challenges that seem to influence students' performance and PISA results. One of them refers to the excessively theoretical nature of the content that students are dealing with. Mathematics teachers employ a wide range of teaching practices to cover different levels of content complexity and to capture students' interest. However, according to the perceptions of students in Moldova, such practices are applied in less than half of the mathematics lessons.

According to the 2022 PISA Analytical and Assessment Framework, which refers to the TALIS evaluation, in addition to mastery of the subject taught, the most closely correlated with learning outcomes are teaching strategies that focus on classroom management, student support, clarity of teaching, cognitive activation, assessment, and feedback. However, for Moldova, the most common types of tasks in mathematics classes remain of purely theoretical nature, such as memorising rules and applying them to solve mathematical problems (52% of students reported that this happens in every lesson or more than half of the lessons). The least common, according to the PISA student questionnaires, are real-life problems such as calculating the electricity consumption of an electronic device³ or determining the price of a computer after adding VAT – which represent the type of problems that students have to solve in the PISA tests. About 52% of students report that their mathematics teacher rarely asks them to think about everyday life problems that can be solved using newly learned mathematical knowledge.

Teacher training in the Republic of Moldova

In Moldova, initial teacher training follows two paths, educational sciences for pre-school and primary school teachers, and specialised training programs for lower and upper secondary teachers.

The first path, educational sciences cover various study areas such as preschool pedagogy, primary education pedagogy, psychopedagogy, and special pedagogy. The focus is on thorough knowledge of the educational phenomenon, formation of skills for organizing the educational process with students, and development of teaching skills.

The second path, lower (Gymnasium) and upper secondary (Lyceum) teachers' training is integrated into the specialized training programs (e.g., physics, chemistry, history) at the first cycle of bachelor's studies. It includes a psycho-pedagogical module to ensure teachers are equipped with both subject-specific knowledge and pedagogical skills.

In 2014, the amendment to the Education Code introduced master's degree as a mandatory requirement for teachers of secondary education. Despite this requirement, the provision is often neglected due to teacher shortages and low attractiveness of the teaching profession among young people.

The psycho-pedagogical module included in the teacher training program for lower and upper secondary schools is centrally regulated and standardized across all pedagogical education institutions. According to the ADA study "Modernization of Teacher Professional Development", Dandara 2015, the emphasis in Moldovan pedagogical

universities is primarily on developing subject teaching skills. Communication skills, teacher-student relationships, and other educational factors are often neglected, being considered part of informal and parental education or implicitly taught.

According to the same study other features of the teacher training in Moldova are traditional approach to psychology, didactic teaching and teacher centred teaching.

The training programs in Educational Sciences focus on traditional and age-specific psychology. Didactic teaching methods are prevalent, which are teacher-centred and structured around lectures. This method is suitable for teaching basic subjects and for students who thrive in structured directions. The teacher training programs, teacher and learning practices, barely address student-centred teaching and student participation. Latest developments in educational sciences suggest that teachers should be competent to handle the complexities of the learning process and understand how the context influence learning.

Among the main key challenges faced by early career teachers revealed by study conducted by National Institute for Education and Leadership in 2024 confirm the challenges mentioned above:

- 1. **Professional unpreparedness**: many new teachers feel unprepared for the complexities of the profession, highlighting the need for more comprehensive training programs.
- 2. **Active student-centred teaching methods**: There's a strong demand for professional development in engaging and interactive teaching strategies.
- 3. **Working with students with special needs**: Early career teachers often require additional training and resources to effectively support students with diverse learning needs.
- 4. **Managing relationships with parents**: Building positive relationships with parents is crucial yet challenging for many early career teachers.
- 5. **Collaborative and supportive Environment**: Mentoring and peer support are essential for the integration and ongoing development of new teachers.

These findings highlight the necessity for a more comprehensive, research-based approach to teacher training in Moldova, ensuring that future educators are well-equipped to handle all aspects of the educational process.

B. Objectives of the assignment

UNDP Moldova intends to contract an organisation or a consortium (hereinafter "the Company") to conduct training activities on contemporary student-centred teaching and learning, aiming to facilitate the students' autonomous motivation and development of 21st century skills.

To achieve the above-mentioned scope, the following specific goals and tasks shall be carried out by the service provider:

- Teachers' needs assessment for improving their skills in applying contemporary pedagogies. The
 contractor will present an inception report, containing the methodology for assessing teachers' needs,
 teachers' needs assessment report, a draft training program, and responsibilities for the implementation
 of the training program.
- Conduct a training of trainer's program (ToT) on contemporary pedagogies to activate students' autonomous motivation. A five-day training course will be conducted for two groups of 25 teachers' trainers each (50 teacher trainers in total). Teacher trainers will be selected by UNDP in collaboration with National Institute for Education and Leadership (INEL). The training course will cover topics ranging from neuroscience and cognitive development, strategies to activate and engage students in learning, as well for mathematics integrated approaches and science lessons, problem/project/phenomena-based learning, and STEAM approach. Additionally, ToT will focus on developing participants' instructional design, delivery and facilitation abilities, as well as their understanding of adult learning principles and group dynamics. 4 days of trainings will be carried out on site and 1 day - online. The course materials will be designed and translated to Romanian no less than two weeks prior to the ToT, should the awarded bidder be a foreign company. The logistic costs for the organization of the in-person trainings will be supported by UNDP.
- 3. Carry out a training program for teachers of 15 Model schools on topics ranging from neuroscience and cognitive development, strategies to activate and engage students in learning, as well as active integrated approaches for mathematics and science lessons, such as problem/project/phenomena-based learning, and STEAM education. The training will be conducted for two groups of 25 mathematics and science teachers each (50 in total) and will consist of four days on site and one day online and one additional follow-up session (online). The facilitation of trainings will be carried out in pairs, by the above trained



teacher trainers (graduates of the ToT program), will share the modules among them, based on their expertise and preferences, being supervised by the trainers of ToT program. The trainers of ToT program will facilitate two training sessions of 1,5 hour each, for presenting an introduction to modern educational theories and evidence-based practices, on which the high performing education systems in the world are grounded in.

The logistic costs for the organization of the in-person trainings will be supported by UNDP.

The trainees will be tasked to work on a project to test their newly acquired active teaching methods with their students. Teachers from the same institution will be working in collaboration on one cross-curricular project. Two follow-up online sessions of 1,5 hours each will be conducted, to present the projects implemented with students.

- 4. Design an in-service teacher training curriculum on contemporary pedagogies. The program should consist of three modules, each module of 24 hours of in person training, cover topics ranging from neuroscience and cognitive development, strategies to activate and engage students in learning, as well as active integrated approaches for mathematics and science lessons, such as problem/project/phenomena-based learning, and STEAM education. The curriculum will be designed in collaboration with local teacher trainers and representatives of the National Institute for Education and Leadership. Coursework will be structured in modules incorporating adult learning theories, authentic experiences, and personal reflection for a deep learning.
- 5. **Organize a one-day final workshop** for sharing lesson learnt, insights and experiences of testing, adjusting and revising student centred teaching and learning in Moldovan schools. The event will be organized for trainers and teachers which graduated the program, as well as representatives of the Ministry of Education and Research, principals, education administrators, school psychologists and social workers, 100 participants in total. The company will consult the workshop agenda with UNDP one month in advance. *The logistic costs for the organization of the in-person trainings will be supported by UNDP.*
- 6. **Develop a report on implemented activities** with specific information on the challenges, conclusions and recommendations on further interventions for implementing contemporary student-centred teaching and learning methods in Moldova.

The Contractor will be responsible for carrying out the trainings, instruction, mentorship sessions with the selected schools in Romanian. Should the bidder be a foreign company, UNDP Moldova shall be responsible for making interpretation arrangements. All communications and documentation related to the assignment required by UNDP will be in English, unless specifically agreed otherwise.

Translation to Romanian of the developed materials shall be covered by the Contractor, should the awarded bidder be a foreign company.

Role of the UNDP Project:
