<p>1. Scope</p>	<p>Proposers are invited to submit a proposal for the services specified in Section 5: Terms of Reference, in accordance with this Request for Proposal (RFP). A summary of the scope of the proposal is included in Section 3: Data Sheet.</p> <p>Proposers shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendment made in writing by UNDP. This RFP is conducted in accordance with Policies and Procedures of UNDP which can be accessed at UNDP Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures/Procurement.</p> <p>As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.</p>
<p>2. Interpretation of the RFP</p>	<p>Any proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the proposer and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any proposer as a result of this RFP.</p>
<p>3. Proprietary information</p>	<p>The RFP documents and any Terms of Reference or information issued or furnished by UNDP are issued solely for the purpose of enabling a proposal to be completed and may not be used for any other purpose. The RFP documents and any additional information provided to proposers shall remain the property of UNDP. All documents which may form part of the proposal will become the property of UNDP, who will not be required to return them to your firm.</p>
<p>6. Publicity</p>	<p>During the RFP process, a proposer is not permitted to create any publicity in connection with the RFP.</p>

<p>7. Clarification of solicitation documents</p>	<p>Proposers may request clarifications on any of the RFP documents no later than the date indicated in Section 3: Data Sheet. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing in the manner indicated in Section 3: Data Sheet. Explanations or interpretations provided by personnel other than the named contact person will not be considered binding or official.</p> <p>UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in</p>

	<p>Section 3: Data Sheet.</p> <p>UNDP shall endeavor to provide responses to clarifications in an expeditious manner, but any delay in such response shall not cause an obligation on the part of UNDP to extend the submission date of the proposals, unless UNDP deems that such an extension is justified and necessary.</p>
8. Amendment of solicitation documents	<p>At any time prior to the deadline for proposal submission, UNDP may for any reason, such as in response to a clarification requested by a proposer, modify the RFP in the form of an amendment to the RFP. Amendments will be made available to all prospective proposers.</p> <p>If the amendment is substantial, UNDP may extend the deadline for submission of proposals to give the proposers reasonable time to incorporate the amendment into their proposal.</p>

9. Cost of preparation of proposal	The proposer shall bear all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of the proposal, regardless of whether its proposal is selected or not. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.
10. Language	The proposal, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the proposer and UNDP, shall be written in the language(s) specified in Section 3: Data Sheet.
11. Documents establishing eligibility and qualifications of the proposer	The proposer shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an eligible and qualified vendor, using the forms provided in Section 7 and providing the documents required in those forms. In order to award a contract to a proposer, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfaction.

Technical proposal format and content	<p>The proposer is required to submit a technical proposal using the forms provided in Section 7 and taking into consideration the requirements in the RFP.</p> <p>The technical proposal shall not include any price or financial information. A technical proposal containing material financial information may be declared non-responsive.</p>
13. Financial proposal	<p>The financial proposal shall be prepared using the form provided in Section 7 and taking into consideration the requirements in the RFP. It shall list all major cost components associated with the services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs.</p> <p>Any output and activities described in the technical proposal but not priced in the financial proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items as well as in the final total price.</p> <p>Prices and other financial information must not be disclosed in any other place except in the financial proposal.</p>
14. Currencies	<p>All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in Section 3: Data Sheet. Where proposals are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all proposals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the proposal into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the UN Operational Rate of Exchange.

15. 16. Proposal validity period	<p>Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in Section 3: Data Sheet, commencing on the deadline for submission of proposals. A proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.</p> <p>During the proposal validity period, the proposer shall maintain its original proposal without any change, including the availability of the key personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.</p> <p>In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request proposers to extend the period of validity of their proposals. Only one proposal</p>	<p>The proposer (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.</p> <p>Proposals submitted by two (2) or more proposers shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • they have at least one controlling partner, director, or shareholder in common; or • any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or • they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or • they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the proposal of another proposer regarding this RFP process;

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • they are subcontractors to each other’s proposal, or a subcontractor to one proposal also submits another proposal under its name as lead proposer; or some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one proposer participates in more than one proposal received for this RFP process. 20. Alternative proposals	<p>Unless otherwise specified in Section 3: Data Sheet, alternative proposals shall not be considered. If submission of alternative proposals is allowed in Section 3: Data Sheet, a proposer may submit an alternative proposal, but only if it also submits a proposal conforming to the RFP requirements. Where the conditions for its acceptance are met, or justifications are clearly established, UNDP reserves the right to award a contract based on an alternative proposal.</p> <p>If multiple/alternative proposals are being submitted, proposer must create an alternate response directly in the system and upload all attachments relevant to the alternate proposal separately together with the alternate response.</p>
21. Pre-proposal conference	<p>When appropriate, a pre-proposal conference will be conducted at the date, time and location and according to any instructions specified in Section 3: Data Sheet.</p> <p>If it is stated in Section 3: Data Sheet that the pre-proposal conference is mandatory, a Proposer which does not attend the pre-proposal conference shall become ineligible to submit a proposal under this RFP.</p> <p>If it is stated in Section 3: Data Sheet that the pre-proposal conference is not mandatory, non-attendance shall not result in disqualification of an interested proposer.</p> <p>UNDP will not issue any formal answers to questions from proposers regarding the RFP or proposal process during the pre-proposal conference. 26. Instruction for proposal submission	<p>The proposer shall submit a complete proposal in the format and comprising the documents and forms in accordance with requirements in Section 3: Data Sheet. The proposal shall be delivered according to the method specified in Section 3: Data Sheet. The proposal shall be submitted by the proposer or person(s) duly authorized to commit the proposer. SECTION 5: TERMS OF REFERENCE

A. Background and Context

The Republic of Moldova has undergone a profound socio-economic transformation since gaining independence in 1991. While the country has achieved sustained economic growth over the past decade, its economy remains relatively undiversified and highly vulnerable to external shocks, particularly those induced by climate variability. Agriculture continues to play a central role in Moldova's economy, employing a significant portion of the population and contributing substantially to GDP. However, this sector is especially sensitive to climate extremes such as droughts, floods, and temperature fluctuations, which are becoming more frequent and severe.

Over the past 130 years, Moldova's climate has become markedly warmer and drier. Scientific assessments and long-term meteorological data indicate a trend toward a semi-arid climate, with projections showing further reductions in precipitation and increased evaporation rates. These changes pose serious risks to water availability, agricultural productivity, forest health, public health, and infrastructure resilience. Moldova ranks among the most climate-vulnerable countries in Europe, and the medium- to long-term impacts of climate change are expected to intensify across social, environmental, and economic dimensions.

Despite these challenges, Moldova has demonstrated strong political commitment to climate action. The country submitted its third Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC 3.0) in 2025, informed by the outcomes of the first global stocktake. It sets ambitious, legally binding targets to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 71% by 2030 and 75% by 2035 compared to 1990 levels, aiming for climate neutrality by 2050. It includes strong methane reduction goals and integrates adaptation priorities across agriculture, energy, forestry, health, transport, and water. The strategy is aligned with EU climate goals and Moldova's accession process, supported by laws and national programs such as the LEDP 2030 and NCCAP 2030. Significant investments are planned in renewable energy, energy efficiency, public infrastructure, and forest expansion. Moldova emphasizes a just transition, gender-responsive planning, and inclusive stakeholder engagement. The country has established robust monitoring and reporting systems and is preparing for participation in international carbon markets.

Importantly, Moldova's climate policy framework emphasizes inclusive and equitable climate action, prioritizing the involvement of vulnerable groups such as women, Indigenous Peoples, and low-income communities in decision-making and benefit-sharing. This reflects a commitment to a just transition, ensuring that climate resilience efforts do not exacerbate existing inequalities.

Institutionally, the Ministry of Environment (MoE) serves as the National Designated Authority (NDA) for the Green Climate Fund (GCF) and is responsible for environmental protection, climate change policy, and natural resource management. The National Commission on Climate Change (NCCC), chaired by the Prime Minister, is mandated to coordinate climate policy implementation across sectors. However, both the MoE and NCCC face capacity constraints that limit their ability to effectively plan, coordinate, and monitor climate action.

To address these challenges, the GCF Readiness grant aims to strengthen Moldova's institutional architecture for climate governance, enhance technical capacities, and improve knowledge management systems. The project will support the operationalization of the NDA and NCCC, mainstream climate priorities into national and sectoral policies, and develop a pipeline of bankable climate finance proposals. It will also promote the development and dissemination of best practices and lessons learned to inform future programming.

The Readiness support specifically targets four critical barriers:

1. Limited capacity for coordination of climate action – including weak inter-institutional mechanisms and under-resourced climate governance bodies.
2. Insufficient planning and mainstreaming of climate action – with climate risks not adequately integrated into national and sectoral development strategies or budgets.

3. Limited financing, funding, and budgeting for climate action – with a heavy reliance on external donor support and limited capacity to develop bankable proposals.
4. Inadequate data, knowledge, and information management – including outdated climate data, weak dissemination platforms, and limited access to evidence-based decision-making tools.

By overcoming these barriers, the project will contribute to Moldova’s ability to meet its national, regional, and global climate commitments, while building long-term resilience and sustainable development pathways. To support the implementation of Moldova’s climate commitments, targeted capacity building is essential across institutions, sectors, and communities. The Readiness grant includes several outputs that directly address institutional strengthening, gender-responsive planning, and climate-resilient technologies.

To implement Moldova’s climate change mitigation commitments under the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the Paris Agreement, as well as for supporting alignment with the EU climate acquis and national development priorities, the Government of the Republic of Moldova approved the Low Emission Development Programme (LEDP) of the Republic of Moldova until 2030 by Government Decision No. 659/2023. The Programme comprises an Action Plan, with measures until 2026, which operationalizes Moldova’s mitigation commitments under the Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) and identifies sector-specific actions across energy, transport, buildings, industry, agriculture, forestry/LULUCF, and waste sectors. Since the approval of the Programme, the Republic of Moldova has adopted an updated and more ambitious Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC 3.0), which establishes revised economy-wide and sectoral greenhouse gas emission reduction targets and enhanced implementation assumptions.

In this context, to ensure continued alignment with Moldova’s updated climate commitments, national legislation, and EU integration processes, UNDP Moldova, in close cooperation with the Ministry of Environment, intends to contract a team of consultants to carry out an evaluation of the implementation of the LEDP2030 and its Action Plan until 2026, and to prepare an updated version of the Programme for the period up to 2030, and a new Action Plan for the period 2027-2030. The new documents will support the integration of climate mitigation priorities into economic planning; promote synergies between climate action and development objectives, including jobs, health, air quality, and biodiversity co-benefits; facilitate consensus-building and support line ministries in aligning development and climate objectives; enhance regulatory certainty for investors through clear medium- and long-term low-emission priorities; improve coordination, stakeholder engagement, and public awareness; and provide early signals to the private sector on emerging investment, research, and innovation opportunities related to low-emission and climate-resilient development pathways.

B. Objective of the Assignment

The overall objective of the assignment is to provide a detailed critical analysis of the implementation of the Low Emission Development Programme of the Republic of Moldova until 2030, compared to the established vision, scope, objectives, and to update the Programme accordingly, in compliance with the requirements of Government Decision No. 386/2020 and in alignment with Moldova’s updated climate policy framework, in particular the nationally adopted NDC 3.0, which introduces revised mitigation ambition and requires corresponding alignment of national policy instruments, including the Low Emission Development Programme, in terms of objectives, sectoral targets, measures, and indicators. Additionally, the Ministry of Environment is currently developing the Long-Term Low Emissions Development Strategy (until 2050), thus, the Programme and the Action Plan for the period 2027–2030 to be developed, will also have to be aligned with the goals and targets form the Long-Term Strategy.

The specific objectives of the assignment are to:

1. Conduct a comprehensive evaluation of the implementation of the Action Plan until 2026 for the implementation of the Low Emission Development Programme until 2030, in line with the methodological and procedural requirements of GD No. 386/2020 on strategic planning, assessing the

- progress achieved, challenges encountered, institutional and financial bottlenecks, and lessons learned in the implementation of mitigation measures across all covered sectors;
2. Review the Programme's relevance and coherence with NDC 3.0 objectives, targets, and implementation assumptions, as well as with national sectoral strategies and EU climate and energy policies; and update, in a gender-responsive manner, the Programme's objectives, sectoral priorities, and quantitative targets to ensure full alignment with NDC 3.0.
 3. Develop a new Action Plan for the implementation of the Programme for the period 2027–2030, including clearly defined measures, timelines, responsible institutions, indicators, and indicative financing needs;
 4. Organize public consultations on updated and gender-sensitive Low Emissions Development Programme until 2030, with involvement of public sector, expert community and civil sector organizations.

C. Scope of Work and expected Outputs

Under the supervision of the Project Manager, the Company/NGO/Consortium will support a set of interlinked activities aimed at strengthening coherence between climate policy and national development planning. The assignment will consist of two interlinked components: (i) Evaluation of the implementation of the Action Plan until 2026 for the implementation the Low Emission Development Programme until 2030, and (ii) Update of the Low Emission Development Programme until 2030, with the development of an Action Plan for the period 2027-2030, with a dedicated emphasis on strengthening the gender–climate nexus, ensuring women and men from diverse groups can equally influence decisions, benefit from climate actions, and contribute to long term climate-resilient development.

The assignment will be implemented using a participatory and evidence-based approach. It will build on a comprehensive desk review of relevant legislation, policy documents, analytical reports, and available data, complemented by an analysis of official statistics, greenhouse gas inventories, and implementation progress reports. The work will include structured consultations with key stakeholders, including line ministries, public institutions, and other entities involved in the implementation of the Programme, to ensure accuracy, ownership, and relevance of findings. The evaluation will be conducted in accordance with the criteria and methodological requirements set out in Government Decision No. 386/2020 on strategic planning, and findings and draft outputs will be subject to iterative validation with UNDP and the Ministry of Environment to ensure technical quality and policy alignment. The Project Policy Officer will provide support to the Company/NGO/Consortium related to legal aspects of assessment and policy document development. The UNDP Gender and Inclusion Analyst will support gender aspects mainstreaming in the policy document.

Evaluation of the implementation of the Action Plan until 2026 for the implementation the Low Emission Development Programme until 2030

- Review the legal, policy, and institutional framework governing the implementation of the LEDP;
- Assess the extent to which planned measures and actions have been implemented, partially implemented, or not implemented;
- Analyze progress against defined targets and indicators, including sectoral mitigation outcomes;
- Evaluate effectiveness, efficiency, relevance, coherence, and sustainability of the Programme, in line with GD No. 386/2020 on strategic planning;
- Identify institutional coordination gaps, capacity constraints, financing challenges, and data limitations;
- Document good practices, lessons learned, and key risks affecting implementation;
- Develop an Evaluation Report with clear findings, conclusions, and recommendations to inform the Programme update.
- Plan and facilitate a stocktaking workshop and coordinate the results of the evaluation with all relevant decision-makers.

Building on the evaluation findings, the Company/NGO/Consortium shall:

Update of the Low Emission Development Programme until 2030

- Update the introductory section to justify the Programme revision in line with NDC 3.0, national development priorities, and EU integration commitments, ensuring coherence with relevant national and sectoral strategies, policy documents, international commitments, and the forthcoming Long-Term Low Emissions Development Strategy (2050).
- Update the situation analysis to reflect recent GHG emissions trends, sectoral developments, and key drivers, identifying main problems, root causes, risks of non-intervention, and impacts on vulnerable groups based on available quantitative and qualitative data, including disaggregated data where feasible.
- Review and revise the Programme’s general objectives, as needed, to ensure alignment with relevant national and sectoral strategies, the Programme’s scope and timeframe, Moldova’s enhanced mitigation ambition under NDC 3.0, and medium-term development priorities.
- Update the Programme’s specific objectives to ensure they are results-oriented, SMART-compliant, and fully aligned with the general objectives, NDC 3.0 sectoral targets, and principles of gender equality and social inclusion.
- Review and update the monitoring framework, including impact and outcome indicators, by defining baselines and intermediate and final targets consistent with national MRV systems, with disaggregation applied where feasible.
- Update the impact section to describe expected medium-term effects of Programme implementation, their contribution to outcome and impact indicators, and related co-benefits, including employment, public health, air quality, biodiversity, and gender equality.
- Revise the costing section by estimating resources required for each specific objective, linking costs to relevant budget programmes, identifying available financing within the Medium-Term Budgetary Framework and external assistance, and clearly indicating financing gaps.
- Identify and describe key risks to Programme implementation, including institutional, financial, regulatory, and capacity-related risks, and propose mitigation and monitoring measures to address them.
- Update the list of authorities and institutions responsible for Programme implementation, clearly identifying lead institutions, contributing entities, and other stakeholders involved in implementation, coordination, and oversight.
- Strengthen and update the Programme’s monitoring, evaluation, and reporting arrangements by describing roles, responsibilities, data collection methods, reporting frequency, and evaluation processes. This section shall ensure transparency, stakeholder participation, and alignment with national monitoring and reporting systems.
- Support stakeholder consultations on the draft updated Programme, including its conformity to the provisions of the GD 386/2020 on strategic planning, as well as GD 967/2016 on the mechanism of public consultations with civil society in the decision-making process.

Develop a new Action Plan for the period 2027–2030 for the implementation of the Low Emission Development Programme until 2030

- Define specific objectives, fully aligned with and directly derived from the descriptive and strategic part of the updated Programme;
- Identify and formulate distinct, concrete actions, clearly attributable and implementable in the short and medium term, designed to achieve the defined specific objectives. Each action shall be uniquely identifiable and codified in accordance with the unified public policy document coding system;
- Develop monitoring indicators for each planned action, ensuring clarity, measurability, and relevance. Where applicable, indicators shall be disaggregated by gender, age, area of residence, socioeconomic status, ethnicity, migration status, or other relevant criteria, in line with national requirements for inclusive and gender-responsive policy planning;
- Estimate implementation costs for each action, including indicative budgets broken down by year and by source of financing. Costing shall specify the relevant budget programme and subprogramme codes,

identify available domestic and external financing (including development assistance), and clearly indicate financing gaps where applicable;

- Define implementation timelines for each action, including start and end dates, presented in a standardized quarter/year format;
- Identify responsible institutions, clearly stating the public authority or institution accountable for the implementation of each planned action, and, where relevant, supporting or coordinating entities.
- Support stakeholder consultations on the new Action Plan for the period 2027–2030, including its conformity to the provisions of the GD 386/2020 on strategic planning, as well as GD 967/2016 on the mechanism of public consultations with civil society in the decision-making process.

The Action Plan shall be presented in a standardized tabular format, consistent with national public policy planning and monitoring requirements, and shall ensure full coherence with the updated Programme objectives, NDC 3.0 targets, and sectoral implementation responsibilities.
