Section 2. Instruction to Bidders

GENERAL PROVISIONS				
1. Introduction	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this ITB, including any amendments made in writing by UNDP. This ITB is conducted in accordance with the UNDP Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures (POPP) on Contracts and Procurement which can be accessed at https://popp.undp.org/SitePages/POPPBSUnit.aspx?TermID=254a9f96-b883-476a-8ef8-e81f93a2b38d		
	1.2	Any Bid submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Bid by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this ITB.		
	1.3	UNDP reserves the right to cancel the procurement process at any stage without any liability of any kind for UNDP, upon notice to the bidders or publication of cancellation notice on UNDP website.		
	1.4	As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.		
2. Fraud & Corruption, Gifts and Hospitality	2.1	UNDP strictly enforces a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical or unprofessional practices, and obstruction of UNDP vendors and requires all bidders/vendors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and contract implementation. 	3.2	It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure that its employees, joint venture

4. Conflict of Interests	4.1	Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:		
which have been engaged by UNDP to provide se of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference		a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;		
		b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the goods and/or services requested under this ITB; or		
		c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.		
	4.2	In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such conflict exists.		
	4.3	Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their Bid their knowledge of the following:		
		a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel who are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving goods and/or services under this ITB; and		
		b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

	4.4	The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this ITB, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Bid.

5. General Considerations	5.1	In preparing the Bid, the Bidder is expected to examine the ITB in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the ITB may result in rejection of the Bid.		
	5.2	The Bidder will not be permitted to take advantage of any errors or omissions in the ITB. Should such errors or omissions be discovered, the Bidder must notify the UNDP accordingly.		
6. Cost of Preparation	6.1	The Bidder shall bear all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of		

of Bid	the Bid, regardless of whether its Bid is selected or not. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.
7. Language	.1 The Bid, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.
8. Documents Comprising the Bid	The Bid shall comprise of the following documents and related forms which details are provided in the BDS: a) Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder; b)Technical Bid; c) Price Schedule; d)Bid Security, if required by BDS; e) Any attachments and/or appendices to the Bid.
9. Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder	.1 The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an eligible and qualified vendor, using the Forms provided under Section 6 and providing documents required in those forms. In order to award a contract to a Bidder, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfaction.
10. Technical Bid Format and Content	0.1 The Bidder is required to submit a Technical Bid using the Standard Forms and templates provided in Section 6 of the ITB.
	0.2 Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within the time specified and unless otherwise specified by the Purchaser, at no expense to the UNDP. If not destroyed by testing, samples will be returned at Bidder's request and expense, unless otherwise specified.
	0.3 When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall describe the necessary training programme available for the maintenance and operation of the equipment offered as well as the cost to the UNDP. Unless otherwise specified, such training as well as training materials shall be provided in the language of the Bid as specified in the BDS.
	0.4 When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall certify the availability of spare parts for a period of at least five (5) years from date of delivery, or as otherwise specified in this ITB.
11. Price Schedule	1.1 The Price Schedule shall be prepared using the Form provided in Section 6 of the ITB and taking into consideration the requirements in the ITB.
	1.2 Any requirement described in the Technical Bid but not priced in the Price Schedule, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.
12. Bid Security	2.1 A Bid Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Bid Security shall be valid for a minimum of thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the Bid.
	2.2 The Bid Security shall be included along with the Bid. If Bid Security is required by the ITB but is not found in the Bid, the offer shall be rejected.
	2.3 If the Bid Security amount or its validity period is found to be less than what is

required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the Bid. 12.4 In the event an electronic submission is allowed in the BDS, Bidders shall include a copy of the Bid Security in their bid and the original of the Bid Security must be sent via courier or hand delivery as per the instructions in BDS. 12.5 The Bid Security may be forfeited by UNDP, and the Bid rejected, in the event of any, or combination, of the following conditions: a) If the Bidder withdraws its offer during the period of the Bid Validity specified in the BDS, or; b) In the event the successful Bidder fails: to sign the Contract after UNDP has issued an award; or to furnish the Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition precedent to the effectivity of the contract that may be awarded to the Bidder. 13. Currencies All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS. Where Bids are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Bids: a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Bid into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Bids; and b) In the event that UNDP selects a Bid for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above. 14. Joint Venture, 14.1 If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Bid, they shall confirm in their Consortium or Bid that : (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested Association with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Bid; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture. 14.2 After the Deadline for Submission of Bid, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP. The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association 14.3 shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of submitting only one Bid. 14.4 The description of the organization of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entities in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the ITB, both in the Bid and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.

	14.5	A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:
		a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
		b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.
	14.6	Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials
	14.7	JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.
15. Only One Bid	15.1	The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Bid, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.
	15.2	Bids submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:
		a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or
		b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
		c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this ITB; or
		d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Bid of another Bidder regarding this ITB process;
		e) they are subcontractors to each other's Bid, or a subcontractor to one Bid also submits another Bid under its name as lead Bidder; or some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Bid received for this ITB process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Bid.
16. Bid Validity Period	16.1	Bids shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, commencing on the Deadline for Submission of Bids. A Bid valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.
	16.2	During the Bid validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its original Bid without any change, including the availability of the Key Personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.
17. Extension of Bid Validity Period	17.1	In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the Bid validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Bids. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shall be considered integral to the Bid.
	17.2	If the Bidder agrees to extend the validity of its Bid, it shall be done without any change to the original Bid.

	17.3 The Bidder has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its Bid, in which case, the Bid shall not be further evaluated.
18. Clarification of Bid (from the Bidders)	18.1 Bidders may request clarifications on any of the ITB documents no later than the date indicated in the BDS. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing in the manner indicated in the BDS. If inquiries are sent other than specified channel, even if they are sent to a UNDP staff member, UNDP shall have no obligation to respond or confirm that the query was officially received.
	18.2 UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in the BDS.
	18.3 UNDP shall endeavour to provide responses to clarifications in an expeditious manner, but any delay in such response shall not cause an obligation on the part of UNDP to extend the submission date of the Bids, unless UNDP deems that such an extension is justified and necessary.
19. Amendment of Bids	19.1 At any time prior to the deadline of Bid submission, UNDP may for any reason, such as in response to a clarification requested by a Bidder, modify the ITB in the form of an amendment to the ITB. Amendments will be made available to all prospective bidders.
	19.2 If the amendment is substantial, UNDP may extend the Deadline for submission of Bid to give the Bidders reasonable time to incorporate the amendment into their Bids.
20. Alternative Bids	20.1 Unless otherwise specified in the BDS, alternative Bids shall not be considered. If submission of alternative Bid is allowed by BDS, a Bidder may submit an alternative Bid, but only if it also submits a Bid conforming to the ITB requirements. Where the conditions for its acceptance are met, or justifications are clearly established, UNDP reserves the right to award a contract based on an alternative Bid.
	20.2 If multiple/alternative bids are being submitted, they must be clearly marked as "Main Bid" and "Alternative Bid"
21. Pre-Bid Conference	21.1 When appropriate, a pre-bid conference will be conducted at the date, time and location specified in the BDS. All Bidders are encouraged to attend. Non-attendance, however, shall not result in disqualification of an interested Bidder. Minutes of the Bidder's conference will be disseminated on the procurement website and shared by email or on the e-Tendering platform as specified in the BDS. No verbal statement made during the conference shall modify the terms and conditions of the ITB, unless specifically incorporated in the Minutes of the Bidder's Conference or issued/posted as an amendment to ITB.

C. SUBMISSION AND OPENING OF BIDS 22. Submission The Bidder shall submit a duly signed and complete Bid comprising the 22.1 documents and forms in accordance with requirements in the BDS. The Price Schedule shall be submitted together with the Technical Bid. Bid can be delivered either personally, by courier, or by electronic method of transmission as specified in the BDS. 22.2 The Bid shall be signed by the Bidder or person(s) duly authorized to commit the Bidder. The authorization shall be communicated through a document evidencing such authorization issued by the legal representative of the bidding entity, or a Power of Attorney, accompanying the Bid. Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Bid, in and of itself, 22.3 implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions. Hard copy (manual) 22.4 Hard copy (manual) submission by courier or hand delivery allowed or submission specified in the BDS shall be governed as follows: a) The signed Bid shall be marked "Original", and its copies marked "Copy" as appropriate. The number of copies is indicated in the BDS. All copies shall be made from the signed original only. If there are discrepancies between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail. (b) The Technical Bid and Price Schedule must be sealed and submitted together in an envelope, which_shall: i. Bear the name of the Bidder; ii. Be addressed to UNDP as specified in the BDS; and Bear a warning not to open before the time and date for Bid opening iii. as specified in the BDS. If the envelope with the Bid is not sealed and marked as required, UNDP shall assume no responsibility for the misplacement, loss, or premature opening of the Bid. Email and Electronic submission through email or eTendering, if allowed as specified in the BDS, shall be governed as follows: eTendering submissions a) Electronic files that form part of the Bid must be in accordance with the format and requirements indicated in BDS; b) Documents which are required to be in original form (e.g. Bid Security, etc.) must be sent via courier or hand delivered as per the instructions in BDS. 22.6 Detailed instructions on how to submit, modify or cancel a bid in the eTendering system are provided in the eTendering system Bidder User Guide and Instructional videos available on this link: http://www.undp.org/content/undp/en/home/operations/procurement/busine ss/procurement-notices/resources/ 23. Deadline for 23.1 Complete Bids must be received by UNDP in the manner, and no later than the Submission of Bids date and time, specified in the BDS. UNDP shall only recognise the actual date and time that the bid was received by UNDP and Late Bids 23.2 UNDP shall not consider any Bid that is received after the deadline for the submission of Bids.

24. Withdrawal, 24.1 A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Bid after it has been submitted at any time prior to the deadline for submission. Substitution, and Modification of Bids 24.2 Manual and Email submissions: A bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Bid by sending a written notice to UNDP, duly signed by an authorized representative, and shall include a copy of the authorization (or a Power of Attorney). The corresponding substitution or modification of the Bid, if any, must accompany the respective written notice. All notices must be submitted in the same manner as specified for submission of Bids, by clearly marking them as "WITHDRAWAL" "SUBSTITUTION," or "MODIFICATION" 24.3 eTendering: A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Bid by Cancelling, Editing, and re-submitting the Bid directly in the system. It is the responsibility of the Bidder to properly follow the system instructions, duly edit and submit a substitution or modification of the Bid as needed. Detailed instructions on how to cancel or modify a Bid directly in the system are provided in the Bidder User Guide and Instructional videos. 24.4 Bids requested to be withdrawn shall be returned unopened to the Bidders (only for manual submissions), except if the bid is withdrawn after the bid has been opened. 25.1 UNDP will open the Bid in the presence of an ad-hoc committee formed by 25. Bid Opening UNDP of at least two (2) members. 25.2 The Bidders' names, modifications, withdrawals, the condition of the envelope labels/seals, the number of folders/files and all other such other details as UNDP may consider appropriate, will be announced at the opening. No Bid shall be rejected at the opening stage, except for late submissions, in which case, the Bid shall be returned unopened to the Bidders. 25.3 In the case of e-Tendering submission, bidders will receive an automatic notification once the Bid is opened. D. EVALUATION OF BIDS 26. Confidentiality Information relating to the examination, evaluation, and comparison of Bids, and the recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to Bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process, even after publication of the contract award. 26.2 Any effort by a Bidder or anyone on behalf of the Bidder to influence UNDP in the examination, evaluation and comparison of the Bids or contract award decisions may, at UNDP's decision, result in the rejection of its Bid and may subsequently be subject to the application of prevailing UNDP's vendor sanctions procedures. 27. Evaluation of Bids 27.1 UNDP will conduct the evaluation solely on the basis of the Bids received. 27.2 Evaluation of Bids shall be undertaken in the following steps: a) Preliminary Examination including Eligibility b) Arithmetical check and ranking of bidders who passed preliminary examination by price. c) Qualification assessment (if pre-qualification was not done) a) Evaluation of Technical Bids

	b) Evaluation of prices		
	Detailed evaluation will be focussed on the 3 - 5 lowest priced bids. Further higher priced bids shall be added for evaluation if necessary		
28. Preliminary Examination	28.1 UNDP shall examine the Bids to determine whether they are complete with respect to minimum documentary requirements, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Bids are generally in order, among other indicators that may be used at this stage. UNDP reserves the right to reject any Bid at this stage.		
29. Evaluation of Eligibility and Qualification	29.1 Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria).		
	29.2 In general terms, vendors that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified:		
	a) They are not included in the UN Security Council 1267/1989 Committee's list of terrorists and terrorist financiers, and in UNDP's ineligible vendors' list;		
	 b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial commitments, 		
	 c) They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the supply of goods and/or services required; 		
	d) They are able to comply fully with the UNDP General Terms and Conditions of Contract;		
	e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and		
	f) They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their clients.		
30. Evaluation of Technical Bid and prices	30.1 The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Bids on the basis of their responsiveness to the Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications and other documentation provided, applying the procedure indicated in the BDS and other ITB documents. When necessary, and if stated in the BDS, UNDP may invite technically responsive bidders for a presentation related to their technical Bids. The conditions for the presentation shall be provided in the bid document where required.		
31. Due diligence	31.1 UNDP reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise, aimed at determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by the Bidder. Such exercise shall be fully documented and may include, but need not be limited to, all or any combination of the following:		
	 a) Verification of accuracy, correctness and authenticity of information provided by the Bidder; 		
	 b) Validation of extent of compliance to the ITB requirements and evaluation criteria based on what has so far been found by the evaluation team; 		
	c) Inquiry and reference checking with Government entities with jurisdiction on the Bidder, or with previous clients, or any other entity that may have done		

		business with the Bidder;
		d) Inquiry and reference checking with previous clients on the performance on on-going or completed contracts, including physical inspections of previous works, as deemed necessary;
		e) Physical inspection of the Bidder's offices, branches or other places where business transpires, with or without notice to the Bidder;
		f) Other means that UNDP may deem appropriate, at any stage within the selection process, prior to awarding the contract.
32. Clarification of Bids	32.1	To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Bids, UNDP may, at its discretion, request any Bidder for a clarification of its Bid.
	32.2	UNDP's request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in the prices or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered, or permitted, except to provide clarification, and confirm the correction of any arithmetic errors discovered by UNDP in the evaluation of the Bids, in accordance with the ITB.
	32.3	Any unsolicited clarification submitted by a Bidder in respect to its Bid, which is not a response to a request by UNDP, shall not be considered during the review and evaluation of the Bids.
33. Responsiveness of Bid	33.1	UNDP's determination of a Bid's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the bid itself. A substantially responsive Bid is one that conforms to all the terms, conditions, specifications and other requirements of the ITB without material deviation, reservation, or omission.

Section 5a: Schedule of Requirements and Bill of Quantities

1. BACKGROUND

The "EU4Moldova: focal regions" Programme supports the strengthening of the economic, territorial and social cohesion in the Republic of Moldova through facilitating inclusive, sustainable and integrated local socio-economic growth and improving the standards of living of the citizens in two focal regions: Ungheni and Cahul municipalities and neighboring communities. The Programme will support the two regions by: making the governance more efficient – improving the quality of services and necessary infrastructure; fostering private sector – increasing investments, improving local economy and creating jobs; encouraging participatory democracy – involving citizens in the process of democratic governance and enhancing their capacities to claim their rights.

The Programme aims to achieve the following objectives: (i) To strengthen transparency, accountability of local public authorities and citizen participation in local governance processes in the focal regions; (ii) To improve citizens' access to quality public services and utilities in the focal regions; (iii) To create employment opportunities for men and women in the focal regions and improve the attractiveness of the focal regions for investors and entrepreneurs; (iv) To promote the smart specialization of the economy of the focal regions through the development of the clustering and value chain approach in key economic sectors.

The expected results of the Programme include: increased institutional capacities of the local public authorities for the implementation of locally-driven environmentally compliant socio-economic development strategy for integrated local growth and development; improved broader stakeholder (e.g. CSO, private sector) engagement in the planning and monitoring of the socio-economic development strategy; increased quality and availability of public services delivery, including in particular those targeting women; and increased performance of local public utilities; more favorable conditions for the attraction of investments, job creation and women and men's entrepreneurship, including social entrepreneurship; increased economic performance of the focal regions as a result of the development and functioning of clusters or specialized area in line with the smart economic specialization approach.

The partners of the Programme are: the EU Delegation to Moldova, UNICEF, Ministry of Agriculture, Regional Development and Environment, the State Chancellery, the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Economy and Infrastructure, central and local governmental authorities from the Ungheni and Cahul focal regions, civil society groups and organizations, private sector and business associations, Agency for Public Services, Agency for Electronic Governance, Regional Development Agencies for South and Center, Congress of Local Authorities from Moldova, The Organization for Small and Medium Enterprises Sector, citizen.

Citizens and communities from Ungheni and Cahul regions, Local Public Authorities, local civil society organizations will be the final beneficiaries of this Programme.

2. SPECIFIC CONTEXT

Ungheni Municipality has functional infrastructure for centralized water supply and sanitation. The water supply and sanitation networks were built mainly during 1962 – 1980 and register now a high degree of wear. All the multistore residential buildings (8841 apartments) are connected to water supply and sanitation system, while only 95% of the individual houses (courtyards) are connected to water supply, and 10% of them to sanitation. The length of the water transportation and distribution networks in Ungheni Municipality accounts for 136 km. The networks are built from different materials: steel, cast iron, asbestos-cement and HDPE, and the oldest ones are made of steel, asbestos-cement and cast iron.

The "Modernization of Local Public Services in the Republic of Moldova" Programme served as an umbrella for developing the study on "Improving Water Supply and Sanitation Services in Ungheni city, Zagarancea village, Semeni village and Petrești village" – the respective study provides in its chapter "Short-Term Actions" for the rehabilitation of 30% out of the total length of 136 km of aqueduct networks from these localities. These actions also cover the rehabilitation of the aqueduct on the Nationala str. and Solidaritate str. from Ungheni municipality, as the segment on the Nationala str. (from the Vasile Lupu str. till the Solidaritate str.) is crossed by the water supply system pipeline linking through its branches the downtown with 6 outskirt districts. The physical condition of the respective aqueduct segment of 1678 m is poor. The infrastructure is worn-out and pipes frequently get broken (at least 3 leakages per month and insufficient pressure in the network), and all these deteriorations induce considerable water losses and additional costs for liquidating the accidents and repairing the damaged segments. Due to all these breakages, water is frequently disconnected, thus leading to activity disturbances of public institutions (hospital, schools, kindergartens) located on the Nationala str., of economic units, and last but not least, of ordinary citizens residing in the Central district of Ungheni city.

On the other hand, in the context of modernizing and renovating the administrative, historical and cultural center of Ungheni city, which is located on the Nationala str., it is necessary to renovate first of all the water supply system so as to allow further modernization works to be undertaken downtown.

To solve the given problem, it is necessary to rehabilitate the water supply network by replacing completely the steel pipes with diameter of 400 mm and installing high density polyethylene pipes (HDPE) with diameter of 400 mm for a length of 1678 m.

3. SCOPE OF WORKS

EU4Moldova: focal regions Programme seeks a company/ consortium of companies which have demonstrated experience in undertaking civil works in Moldova to undertake the works for "Rehabilitation of the water supply network on the Nationala str. and Solidaritate str. in the Ungheni Municipality". The works' content includes the following types of works: constructions works, installing water networks, land use and fitting out works, testing the water supply system, and launching into operation. As a result of project implementation, the beneficiaries of the EU4Moldova: focal regions Programme will benefit from 24/24 hours drinking water supply, and namely: 24 820 citizens, 2 847 individual houses, 3 245 apartments, 942 economic units, 18 public institutions, Ungheni mayoralty, and ME "APĂ CANAL UNGHENI".

The Contractor must ensure all the necessary elements for the successful fulfilment of the contract: labor, engineering, installations and equipment, support materials, transportation, machines and mechanisms, tools, overheads needed for carrying out all the works under this contract. Transportation of materials shall be

the responsibility of Contractor. Residues formed as a result of civil works undertaken will be evacuated by the Contractor to authorized dumps.

The Contractor will be responsible for:

- preparing the site so as to ensure security and storage of materials, machinery and equipment necessary for carrying out the works;
- construction works fitting the water supply network and installing equipment and facilities;
- launching into operation and operating the installed networks, facilities and equipment, including carrying out performance tests and operational tests;
- provision of detailed documentation on operation and maintenance of installed objects and systems;
- organizing training and offering training materials, developed for responsible operators authorized by the beneficiaries.

The respective project design was developed, coordinated, endorsed and verified as established in the national normative documents in force in construction area. The aqueduct segment from the Nationala str. and Solidaritate str. with diameter of 400mm is a component part of the water supply system in Ungheni municipality.

The scope of works envisages the rehabilitation of the aqueduct segment from the Nationala str. and Solidaritate str. in Ungheni municipality by replacing the existing pipes, which type, diameter and length are as follows:

The following works must be performed:

Fitting works: installing manually or mechanically operated fittings on the water pipelines and manual handling so as to isolate different areas in the network– 36 units.

Earthworks: mechanical digging of soil with natural humidity – 2911 m3

manual digging for supplementing the embankment - 802 m3

soil compacting with pneumatic knockers - 2634 m3 supporting the banks with metal planks - 4480 m2

Pipe fitting works: installing the polyethylene pipes – 1721.5 m

Manholes' construction works: building manholes of precast reinforced concrete – 33.57 m3.

Dismantling and refurbishing parts of carriageway and roadsides:

Asphalt concrete blanket - 692 m2.

- Installing precast concrete borders - 168 m.

- Sowing the lawns - 752.5 m2

The technology of aqueduct network construction works shall be compliant with the requirements set in the standard CH 478-80 "Guideline for design and installation of plastic pipe networks", SNIP 3.05.04.-85 "Watersupply and sewerage outdoor networks and structures (with changes)", and the requirements provided in the Law No. 186 of 10.07.2008 on Occupational Safety and Health.

The following works shall be carried out on compulsory basis:

- The trench bed. Taking into account that the soil in the area of the trench digging is of II compacting category (the compacting of the soil when wetted up to 20 cm under its own weight), the design envisages compacting the soil of trench bed down to 0.6m depth at the density of 1.65 t/m3 at the lower border. The compacting of the soil (bed) under the pipes and manholes shall be performed with a manually operated compacter vibrator.
- The trench profile. The depth of pipes' laying shall be carried out in line with the longitudinal profiles of the networks from the design. In places with dry and hard soil, it is necessary to prepare a 150mm-thick sand bed. The subsequent patching shall be carried out with local clayey soil, in layers of 0.3m with compacting on both sides of the pipes installed in the ditch. The backfilling with soft soil 300mm shall be carried out without including gravel and shall be compacted manually. The soil for subsequent backfilling should have optima humidity. The density of the compacted dry soil should be not lower than 1.6-1.7 tf/m3 and shall be confirmed by tests performed by a laboratory accredited in this area.
- Welding of pipes and sealing of tubes. The pipes shall be welded using the butt welding method, as well as electro-fusion sleeve method. The branches shall be connected to the operating networks as specified for every joint in the design.
- Building and waterproofing the manholes: the manholes shall made of precast reinforced concrete rings with specific diameters set in the design. The manholes' lids shall be made of cast iron. All the outside surfaces shall be insulated with a layer of bituminous putty δ =5mm. The bottom plate of the manhole shall be installed on a sand layer, δ =100mm. All the metal elements shall be painted twice with painting $\Pi\Phi$ 115 GOST 6465-76 on a priming layer $\Gamma\Phi$ 021 GOST 25219-87.
- Protection tubes: shall be installed at the wall crossings being made of steel.

7.1 Labeling of equipment

All the installations and equipment shall be labeled with original manufacturer's plates, which should include at least the production year, main technical parameters and type/ID of the equipment. All the text labeling necessary for operating the system shall be in Romanian and Russian languages

7.2 Maintenance

After reception of works and launch into operation of the site, the Contractor must ensure the servicing and maintenance of the installed aqueduct system for a period of one year. At the same time, the Beneficiary shall be entitled to raise claims against the Contractor after the final launch into operation of the site. The servicing and maintenance works shall include:

- Periodical verification/maintenance works (1-2 times per year);
- Interventions on the site and repairing works in exceptional cases;
- Technical assistance on the phone in relation to system operation.

8. Reception by the end of works.

After finishing the construction works and sending all the execution documents, the procedure for launching the site into operation will be organized by Ungheni Mayoralty in line with the provisions set in the national Regulation regarding the reception of constructions works and related installations, approved via the Government Decision No. 285 of 23.05.1996 with subsequent amendments.

9. Warrantee period

The warrantee period for the performed works and installed equipment shall start on the date of site reception upon the end of the works and shall last for 12 months for equipment and 36 months for works and materials.
