Section 2. Instruction to Bidders

A. GENERAL PROVISIONS				
1. Introduction	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. 	1.2	Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP.		
	1.3	As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (<u>www.ungm.org</u>). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.		
2. Fraud & Corruption, Gifts and Hospitality	2.1	UNDP strictly enforces a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical or unprofessional practices, and obstruction of UNDP vendors and requires all bidders/vendors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and contract implementation. 4. Conflict of Interests	 4.1 Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they: a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process; b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP. 4.2 In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such a conflict exists. 4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following: a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices. 4.4 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as

6. Cost of Preparation of Proposal	6.1 The Bidder shall bear any and all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of the Proposal, regardless of whether its Proposal was selected or not. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.
7. Language	7.1 The Proposal, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.
8. Documents	8.1 The Proposal shall comprise of the following documents:

In order to award a contract to a Bidder, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfaction.
10.Technical Proposal Format and Content	10.1 The Bidder is required to submit a Technical Proposal using the Standard Forms and templates provided in Section 6 of the RFP.
	10.2 The Technical Proposal shall not include any price or financial information. A Technical Proposal containing material financial information may be declared non-responsive.
	10.3 Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within the time specified and unless otherwise specified by UNDP, and at no expense to UNDP
	10.4 When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall describe the necessary training programme available for the maintenance and operation of the services and/or equipment offered as well as the cost to the UNDP. Unless otherwise specified, such training as well as training materials shall be provided in the language of the Bid as specified in the BDS.
11. Financial Proposals	11.1 The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the Standard Form provided in Section 6 of the RFP. It shall list all major cost components associated with the services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs.
	11.2 Any output and activities described in the Technical Proposal but not priced in the Financial Proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.
	11.3 Prices and other financial information must not be disclosed in any other place except in the financial proposal.
12. Proposal Security	12.1 A Proposal Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Proposal Security shall be valid up to thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the Proposal.

UNDP reserves the right to reject any Proposal at this stage.
29.Evaluation of Eligibility and Qualification	29.1	Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria).
	29.2	 In general terms, vendors that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified: a) They are not included in the UN Security Council 1267/1989 Committee's list of terrorists and terrorist financiers, and in UNDP's ineligible vendors' list; b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial

	 commitments, c) They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity where applicable, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the provision of the services required; d) They are able to comply fully with UNDP General Terms and Conditions of Contract; e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and f) They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their clients.
30. Evaluation of Technical and Financial Proposals	30.1 The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and other RFP documents, applying the evaluation criteria, sub-criteria, and point system specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria). A Proposal shall be rendered non-responsive at the technical evaluation stage if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the BDS. When necessary and if stated in the BDS, UNDP may invite technically responsive bidders for a presentation related to their technical proposals. The conditions for the presentation shall be provided in the bid document where required.
	30.2 In the second stage, only the Financial Proposals of those Bidders who achieve the minimum technical score will be opened for evaluation. The Financial Proposals corresponding to Technical Proposals that were rendered non-responsive shall remain unopened, and, in the case of manual submission, be returned to the Bidder unopened. For emailed Proposals and e-tendering submissions, UNDP will not request for the password of the Financial Proposals of bidders whose Technical Proposal were found not responsive.
	30.3 The evaluation method that applies for this RFP shall be as indicated in the BDS, which may be either of two (2) possible methods, as follows: (a) the lowest priced method which selects the lowest evaluated financial proposal of the technically responsive Bidders; or (b) the combined scoring method which will be based on a combination of the technical and financial score.
	30.4 When the BDS specifies a combined scoring method, the formula for the rating of the Proposals will be as follows:

Section 5. Terms of Reference

A. PROJECT TITLE: One UN Joint Action Cross-river support for human rights

B. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

General Background:

The Swedish-funded One UN Joint Action Cross-river support for human rights is expected to contribute to the improvement of the human rights situation on both banks of the Nistru River by: 1) developing the capacities of vulnerable right-holders to exercise their human rights; 2) developing the capacities of duty-bearers to fulfil their human rights obligations; and by 3) enhancing the human rights culture in the Transnistrian region.

In line with these objectives and the HRBA, which envisages not only the empowerment of right-holders, but also the improved capacities of the duty-bearers to promote, respect and protect human rights, the Programme proposes to offer a training programme for the staff of the Bureau for Reintegration Policies (further – Bureau). These activities will focus on the HRBA principles related to the activity of the Bureau, as well as on improving the conflict-sensitiveness, consensus building and multiple stakeholders' negotiations. This will allow the Bureau to better react and support the advocacy efforts of the Sustainable (Community) Development Platform (SCDP) on both banks of the Nistru. A better understanding of the human rights implications of the Bureau's activities will help it in formulating the arguments and to make connections with the work done on the ground by the members of the SCDP, as well as to put them on the agenda of the working groups within the settlement process.

C. SCOPE OF WORK

In order to overcome the existing deficiencies, the Programme is seeking one or more local company /NGO (hereinafter Contractor) to develop the methodology and the curricula of the training, combining both theoretical and practical sessions, including real case studies and simulation exercises, and, correspondingly, provide the training. The objectives of the training and the indicative list of topics, to be covered during this exercise, are presented below.

Based on the assessed needs of the Bureau and following the preliminary discussions, it is envisaged that the trainings will be provided to a group of maximum 10 staff members of the Bureau. They will be divided in subgroups of 2-4 persons and will participate twice a week in online couching sessions, due to the COVID-19-related restrictions. Once a week the group will participate in a plenary online session with a practical exercise.

D. KEY TASKS/ACTIVITIES AN EXPECTED OUTPUTS

The Contractor shall take full responsibility for the execution and delivery of the following tasks and outputs to achieve the objectives of the assignment as described below:

TASK 1: Develop the methodology and the curricula of the training based on the requested topics. **TASK 2²:** Provide the training based on the approved methodology and the curricula of the training.

- Overcoming inhibitions and other emotional obstacles;
- How to deal with hostile negotiation tactics;
- Strategies and tactics in negotiation process.

- Better understand various human-rights-related aspects of the activity of the Bureau;
- Apply HRBA in their daily activity, especially when interacting with representatives of vulnerable groups;
- Improve their cooperation with representatives of civil society and apply participatory approach in the negotiation process, specifically the activity of the Human Rights WG;
- Improve the conflict-sensitiveness of the staff and their activity;
- Improve their understanding of the mediation and dispute resolution processes;
- Better understand the consensus building and the negotiation processes and apply this knowledge in their every-day activity;
- Approach the negotiation process in a structured and sequential manner;
- Identify factors that influence a negotiation situation;
- Recognize strategies and tactics used by the negotiation partner;
- Positively solve problems and conflict situations in a negotiation;
- Apply influencing and persuasion techniques to obtain the desired result;
- Create an atmosphere adequate for implementing the objectives identified;
- Establish productive long-term relations with the negotiation partner.
